<p>Additional teacher to enable reduced group sizes for maths lessons, providing teachers with more time to have one to one interactions with and individualise learning for pupil premium children.</p> <p>1:2 support to improve progress in reading and writing, provided by a qualified teacher.</p> <p>Individualised academic support for identified learners provided by qualified teacher (1:1).</p> <p>The provision of Able Writers workshops and Gifted and Talented maths workshops involving able children from other schools.</p> <p>Provision of 27 hours learning mentor support.</p> <p>Training in 'Reading Recovery' and additional Teaching Assistant time to support specific interventions.</p> <p>The development of HLTA role for SEN and Inclusion.</p> <p>Purchase of Reading books and resources to raise standards of reading and promote interest.</p> <p>Purchase of assessment resources and CPD to improve assessment for learning.</p> <p>Provision of after school 'parent link' sessions to give parents the opportunity for informal conversations and to support children's home learning.</p> <p>Funding of 'Play Leaders', supporting the development of improved social skills, health and</p>

fitness, including after school clubs.
